Kelley Davis, Ph.D., is a Professor of Microbiology in the College of Medical Sciences and has worked at Nova Southeastern University since 2003. In addition, she is the Director of the Master of Science in Disaster and Emergency Preparedness degree program for the College of Osteopathic Medicine. In 2014, along with a few medical students, Dr. Davis helped start a campus Community Emergency Response Team in association with the Town of Davie. She is a spokesperson for recognition, diagnosis, and treatment of victims in mass casualty and mass care events and provides education on topics related to biological weapons, and weapons of mass threat in general. Dr. Davis teaches courses



in virology, immunology, and bacteriology, with emphasis on the medical aspects of infectious disease, for students in the medical, public health, and other allied health fields. Dr. Davis is a recognized authority on topics related to CBRNE (Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosives) and disaster health and preparedness. Prior to her university affiliation, Dr. Davis worked in law enforcement and has combined her experiences in law enforcement with her background in microbiology to become a leader in the field of toxic substance mitigation and response related to disaster and emergency preparedness.
